

Maritime leaders today have to navigate a highly complex landscape. Shifts in the geostrategic environment, new shipping regulations, increasing cost pressures as well as the advent of new and potentially disruptive technologies all add to the multi-faceted challenges facing the maritime industry. Coupled with opportunities presented by shifts in trade and consumption patterns and the opening of alternative trade routes, the role of senior management is more complex than ever.

The Advanced Maritime Leaders' Programme (AMLPL) is a global maritime leadership programme, uniquely designed for senior maritime leaders who are heading the maritime or port administration in their respective countries.

With a focus on transformational leadership, AMLPL participants will acquire new techniques, skills and interaction tools to advance their capabilities as leaders and bring positive change to their maritime organisations. The programme offers insights on the complexities and challenges in the international maritime industry and discusses strategies on strategic management, policy-making, stakeholder engagement and crisis communications drawing upon case studies and contemporary examples. Through peer-to-peer sharing and learning, participants will also develop a valuable network with global peers in the maritime world.

AMLPL is organised by MPA Academy in partnership with the Singapore Management University, and supported by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs under the Singapore Cooperation Programme.
